Hello my name is... Backswimmer



- I swim on my back, that's how I got my name.
- I use my long back legs to chase after my prey.
- I am perfectly camouflaged with white on my back and black on my belly.
- Even though I primarily live in the water I can fly.
- I recommend not touching me with your hands, I bite and it hurts.



Hello my name is... Damselfly Nymph



- I'm just a baby. It takes up to 3 years of growing before I come out of the water and become an adult.
- My tails are actually my gills. They are very fragile so be careful when you hold me.
- Some people get me confused with my cousin the dragonfly. My body is long and slender.
- My favorite meal is other aquatic insects and tiny crustaceans.



Hello my name is... Dragonfly Nymph



- I'm just a baby. I live in the water and grow for 2 to 5 years before I come out of the water and become an adult.
- I catch my prey by shooting out my lower jaw like a chameleon tongue.
- I can get away from danger fast by blowing air out of my abdomen.
- Humans like me when I'm a grown up dragonfly, because I can eat 100 mosquitoes a day.



Hello my name is... Giant Water Bug



- I can grow to be really big; 2 inches or more!
- I'm so big I can catch tadpoles, fish and frogs for my meal.
- Water is in my name, but I am a strong flyer too.
- Be careful if you find me; hold me from the back or I might bite.



Hello my name is... Predaceous Diving Beetle



- As my name says, I am a predator. I'm not a picky eater; I eat whatever I can catch.
- I am one of the most common aquatic insects you can find.
- Unlike damselflies and dragonflies, I have a complete metamorphosis where I dig into the mud and form a pupa and then I emerge from the water as an adult.
- In my larval stage my nickname is the water tiger.



Hello my name is... Water Boatman



- Don't get me confused with my cousin the backswimmer; I swim on my belly.
- My back is dark, but I can look silver because I carry my air in a bubble like a scuba tank on my back.
- I have to hold onto vegetation so I stay underwater. My air bubble makes me float when I don't want to.
- I have long back legs that help me paddle through the water.




Hello my name is... Water Scorpion



- I use my camouflage as a reed to ambush my prey. I can stand still for hours.
- Don't worry my tail isn't a stinger; it's more like a snorkel.
- Be careful when you handle me. I bite and it hurts.
- Even though I'm aquatic, I don't swim very well. I like slow moving water where I can crawl in the vegetation.
